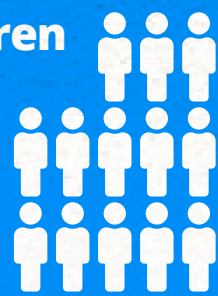

Polio Outbreak Response (POBR)

Improved planning, coordination of campaign, and provision of technical assistance in targetted states.

Increased reach of eligible children in security-compromised settlements 90% of the children planned for were reached during the SIA campaign in Kano and Sokoto.

Zamfara conducted 3 campaigns (SIA, RES and IEV).

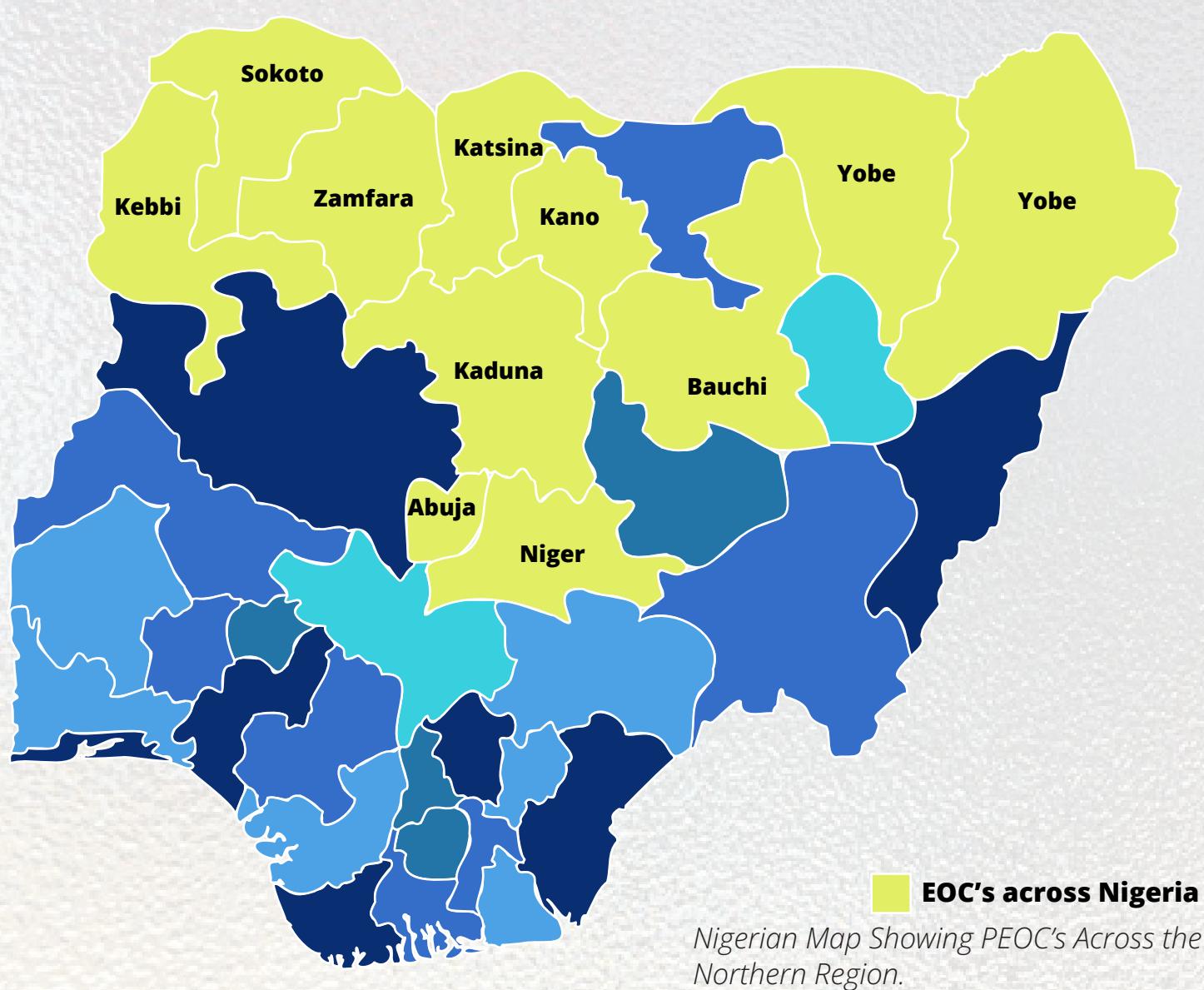





The project contributed to environmental sustainability by achieving **CO2** savings of **202.29** tonnes through the use of renewable energy across PEOCs in Bauchi, Borno, Kebbi, Katsina, Yobe, Niger, and Zamfara.

**11,676.13 kWh** of solar power was produced across the seven PEOCs, with an average utilization of **82%**.

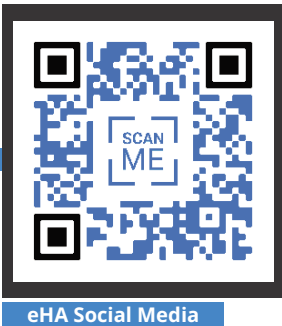


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
